



# Mullaquana project to create more jobs

The Uranium SA project at Mullaquana is expected to create at least 40 jobs when work begins at the end of 2013.

Company projects and development manager Nicole Galloway Warland spoke to more than 50 interested residents during an information session recently.

She said although the project would be a small to medium sized employer the spin off results of the project would benefit a lot of other businesses in town.

The Company is in the process of applying for the permits and license required to carry out a field leach trial at the Blackbush Prospect in its Mullaquana Project.

The trial will enable the company to determine how to extract the mineralisation and manage the environmental aspects of the process.

“We place high importance in keeping the local community informed as

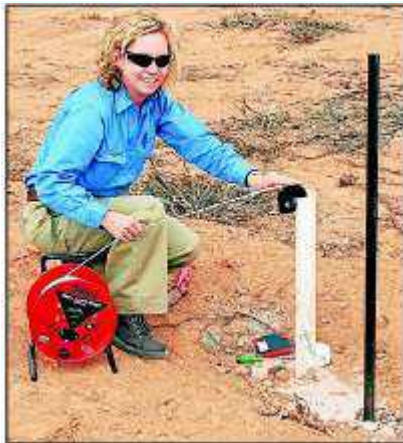
much as possible about our plans for our Mullaquana Uranium Project, and this also is a good opportunity for us to receive constructive feedback from local residents and landowners,” Ms Warland said.

“A lot of concerns were raised and questions asked during the session.

“It was interesting to hear peoples views and apart from answering questions during the session we are doing follow-up via emails and letters.

UraniumSA has been exploring in the area, south of Whyalla, since 2007.

Drilling is continuing to discover extensive new mineralisation at the Blackbush Prospect and the company plans to announce new resource figures shortly.
