### First official document lodged

UraniumSA has recently submitted its referral of proposed action for an in-situ recovery field trial at its Mullaquana project to the Commonwealth Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities.

This is the first piece of documentation in a regulatory process administered by commonwealth and state regulatory agencies that UraniumSA needs to complete to be allowed to commence its proposed in-situ recovery field trial at the Blackbush deposit.

It is anticipated that the department would respond within 20 working days.

The company is also progressing work on the development of documentation supporting an application for a retention lease, which will be sought under the state government's Mining Act.

UraniumSA is continuing work to determine its amenability to in-situ recovery mining.

Further metallurgical test work is in progress, local and regional hydrogeological pump testing has been completed and results would be available shortly.

Meanwhile the company has successfully arranged to raise \$5 million before costs through the placement of 20 million fully paid ordinary shares at 25 cents each.

The funds raised by the placement will be used to sustain the progression of the Blackbush Prospect to an in-situ recovery field trial and pursue other exploration.
