



# Jobs at Mullaquana

Uranium SA is looking at creating more jobs at its Mullaquana project site.

The company is looking for a geotechnical trainee and general hand for skilled and unskilled labouring work.

Company general manager Mullaquana project Alistair Muir said as far as possible the company would be taking into considering local applicants.

He said as the project was now progressing at a rapid rate the company would start hiring people as and when necessary.

"We want to recruit and train people from Whyalla if we get suitable applicants," Mr Muir said.

"This is a good opportunity for young enthusiastic workers

and hopefully we will find the right person from Whyalla."

For the geotechnical trainee position the company is looking for applicants from a science background with good math and computer skills.

The person applying for general hand should be fit and willing to work out doors.

Both positions require full drivers license.

Mr Muir said the site has six Whyalla based employees at the moment and were looking into hiring at least four more in the near future.

He said the project was progressing well and the company wanted to promote local employment as much as possible.

UraniumSA is an Adelaide

based uranium only explorer specialising in sediment hosted styles of uranium mineralisation.

The company discovered sediment hosted uranium mineralisation within its Mullaquana project a few years ago and is working to advance the Blackbush Prospect to an in-situ recovery field trial as soon as practicable.

A public consultation is expected to be held in March/April and trials are expected to start before the end of this year.

Depending on the success of the trial the company aims to start full production by late 2015.
