Uranium SA to hold information session

South Australian uranium explorer, UraniumSA, will hold two public information sessions this week.

The sessions will be held at the Whyalla Yacht Club on Wednesday, May 4 and Thursday, May 5 to offer local residents the chance to learn more about its proposed uranium recovery field trial at Mullaquana.

The two sessions will run from 4pm until 8pm, and will provide residents the opportunity to directly ask questions to the company's expert team.

Project manager of the

Mullaquana Project, Alistair Muir said the information sessions would be a "great mix of one-on-one interaction and group presentation sessions".

"The Whyalla community is central to the success of this field trial and its potential progression to full-scale operation, and it's vital that local people can access clear and straightforward information about it," Mr Muir said.

"We're trialling an in-situ recovery method of mining, which is a fully contained process.

"However, people will understandably have questions about what this trial could mean for the region and the environment.

"We will be setting up a number of tables at the Yacht Club where people can learn more about specific elements of the project and a short presentation will be given to all attendees every hour, on the hour, to summarise some of the key questions that have been raised."
